ARPA Funding Update

The City of Boulder City received \$21.7 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in 2022. In July, City Council approved a plan to invest the funds on a variety of projects, including infrastructure improvements as well as to help local organizations. Here is a look at some of the larger expenditures as of December 31, 2022 (*unaudited report*):

Youth sports and pool fees	\$175,000	\$175,000
EV vehicle pilot program	\$350,000	\$349,632

Municipal Court unfunded mandates	\$300,000	\$272,202
Emergency Aid assistance	\$100,000	\$38,680
See Spot Run requests	\$50,000	\$50,000
Fire Department AED program	\$50,000	\$49,407
Police Department tasers	\$126,000	\$126,000
PD mobile field crowd control equipment	\$65,000	\$53,576

Spending since City Council approved the budget totals more than \$3.3 million. The Fire Department substation, City facilities and security upgrades, and the Municipal Golf Irrigation projects will be addressed in the coming year.
