


BOULDER CITY PARKWAY COMPLETE STREETS, PHASE 2 VIRTUAL PUBLIC MEETING

Options Being Considered for Boulder City's Wastewater

Since 1965, Boulder City has released its wastewater into an evaporation ponds near the Municipal Airport. Solids are removed and the water is treated only to industrial use levels, such as dust control. Currently, between 1.2 million and 1.5 million gallons of this wastewater, called effluent, is released daily.



City Council members are calling for sustainable wastewater management. They heard four options for effluent reuse to reduce our consumptive usage of water from the Southern Nevada Water Authority. Council Members selected two options for further studies:

- **Option 2: Direct Reuse**
- **Option 3: Return to Lake Mead via a Recharge Well**

The feasibility studies may take six months or more to complete. Learn about the options at www.bcnv.org/water, where there is a short survey you may complete. City staff will seek additional public input after the feasibility studies are complete, likely in late 2023 or in 2024. If you have questions, email staff at water@bcnv.org.
