Boulder City's Strategic Plan 2025-2030

A strategic plan is the process in which an organization or a community defines its vision for the future and identifies goals and objectives to achieve that vision. In the case of a city strategic plan, the process involves community input, examination of community strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (called a SWOT analysis) and the development of measurable, actionable goals that city staff can implement over several years to accomplish the community's vision.

In December 2018, the City Council adopted through Res. No. 6875 the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan for Boulder City. The plan included action items focused around five key goals developed through community input and City Council direction. During the next five years, city staff worked to implement those goals. Quarterly, city staff presented updates on the action plan implementation process to the public and the City Council. The city completed the action items contained in the 2020-2025 strategic plan in 2023. This presents an opportunity for the City Council to work with the community to develop a new strategic plan for 2025-2030.

Emergent Method has been hired to work with the community to develop the next strategic plan. Robyn Stiles, PH.D. Managing Director, will be engaging citizens through several methods over the next two months:

- Online Survey
- Community Workshops
- Focus Groups
- Participation in a SWOT analysis

You will be asked what is working well in the community and what needs more attention. You will have the chance to provide your input on which goals the community should focus on over the next five years.



Avoid Costly Fees... Get Your Pet Licensed

Pet owners could face fines without a current license

Pet licenses are valid from January to January, and are available at City Hall in the Utilities Office Monday through Thursday and the Boulder City Animal Shelter by appointment only — call 702.293.9283.



You must present a valid rabies vaccination certificate with date of inoculation indicating spay/neuter status (invoices are not accepted).

Licensing Fees for dogs and cats:

- \$4.00/year (license up to three years based on vaccination)
- Late fee: \$2.00 per license

Licensing Fees for pot belly pigs:

- Initial fee: \$100
- Renewal fee: \$50
