# VOTE!



Boulder City voters who are registered to vote no later than 14 days before Election Day will automatically receive a mail ballot - whether or not they requested one, unless they opted-out. All Boulder City registered voters may vote in-person on a voting machine at an Early Voting or Election Day site, even if they received a mail ballot. Completed mail ballots may also be dropped off at City Hall (401 California Ave., Boulder City, NV 89005) during business hours of Monday-Thursday 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., starting October 24 through November 4.

## Voters to Decide on Funds for Swimming Pool Recreational Project

The current Boulder City pool is forty-four years old and after an in-depth review and comparative analysis on repair vs replacement, the City directed staff to pursue replacement. Replacing the pool will allow the programs that the community has come to appreciate to continue, and keep the pool in compliance with current health code and accessible for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

In June 2021, voters approved use of the proceeds from the sale of Tract 350 (land next to Boulder Creek Golf Club), and a one-time appropriation of \$7,000,000 from the Capital Improvement Fund (mostly revenue from land and solar leases) toward a Swimming Pool Recreational Project.

Construction, materials and labor costs have steeply increased in the past three years: the same Swimming Pool Recreational Project estimated to cost \$27 million in 2021, is estimated to cost \$36 million today. In November 2024, voters will determine if the City should use up to and not to exceed \$9 million from the Capital Improvement Fund, in addition to the \$7 million previously approved. The Capital Improvement Fund currently has more than \$12 million in funds that have yet to receive direction from the voters to be spent. The plan to fund the new swimming pool would not increase taxes.
