“Take Control in 1, 2, 3” – Preparing for Emergencies

September is National Preparedness Month. Older adults face greater risks during emergencies, especially if they live alone, have a low- or fixed-income, or have a disability. Boulder City is an older community, with the average age of our residents being 51 years old, and more than 30 percent of elderly residents have a disability. (For comparison, the average for City of Las Vegas residents is 38 years

old.) What can older adults do today to prepare? The Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) says you can “Take Control in 1, 2, 3.”



1. **Assess your needs.** Each of us may have unique needs. Perhaps you rely on oxygen at night or use mobility/assistive devices. Some medications need refrigeration. No one knows better than you what is essential in an emergency. Consider what you, your family and your pets need to stay safe in a disaster or emergency.
2. **Make a plan.** Now that you know what you need, create plans around those needs. Build a kit that includes necessities, such as extra medications or batteries for assistive devices. Make sure you plan for your pets or service animals, too.
3. **Engage your support network.** Family, friends and neighbors are vital before, during and after a disaster or emergency. Share your emergency plan with everyone in your group, including friends or relatives who live in other communities that would not be impacted by the same emergency. Tell them how you would evacuate your home or workplace and where you would go in case of a disaster.
